Jori Chisholm Featured for March Program

Jori Chisholm returns home to OPS as our featured piper for the month of March. Jori grew up in Lake Oswego, where he started piping at age 11 with instruction from Colin MacKenzie. A competitor from an early

age, lori has emerged as one of the world's premier professional pipers, winning top prizes including the first-ever United States Gold Medal Piping Championship, the Royal Scottish Pipers' Society Bronze Star for First Place in the 'A' Marches at the Argyllshire Gathering in Oban, and Runner-Up in the Silver Medal Piobaireachd at the Northern Meeting in Inverness – all on his first attempt. In 2008, Jori won the Open 'A' Piobaireachd at the Cowal Highland Gathering, the largest highland game in the world. Earlier this year, he won the U.S. Gold Medal for Piobaireachd for the third time.

Jori is a member of the fivetime World Champion Simon Fraser University Pipe Band. He has appeared on numerous recordings as a soloist and pipe band member, including a live concert recording at the renowned Sydney Opera House. In addition, Jori has performed with many notable musicians, includ-

ing Irish band The Chieftains and legendary ex-Grateful Dead rocker Bob Weir and RatDog.

Jori's long-anticipated fulllength solo studio album, Bagpipe Revolution, was released late last year to rave reviews and an Album of the Year nomination by PipesDrums. The CD features contemporary and traditional pipe tunes played on the highland bagpipes and Scottish small pipes with innovative instrumental accompaniment.

Jori lives in Seattle where he teaches piping full time to students of all skill levels. He also uses video conferencing as part of his pioneering long-distance education program BagpipeLessons.com. He welcomes new students at this time.

Founded in 2006, the band finished second overall for the 2008 Grade III competition season in aggregate ratings by British Columbia Pipers Association. Portland Metro Pipe Band was selected to perform with legendary Irish

Bruce Gandy Headlines February Gathering

The February meeting of OPS began with our featured "Local Hero" Dan DelMain, who played a variety of light music. His performance was followed by the Fort Vancouver Pipe Band, based in Vancouver Wash. The band's membership is primarily older adult players at the beginning level.

Bruce Gandy, who headlined the evening's schedule, played a set of 1939 Henderson's along

with a MacCallum chanter and a Gannaway bag. Bruce was, as Announcer Michael Riedel noted, fresh off the "tour" from the Seattle area teaching at the MSA Winter School. He had also conducted a workshop earlier in the day for beginning and intermediate pipers in the Portland area and planned a workshop for advanced

his medley for the Metro Cup. For the piobaireached aficionados in the audience, Bruce played a great Mac-Crimmon tune Too Long in This Condition. He gave a short explanation about the background of the tune name and then warmed up with a 3/4 March before playing the big tune.

Grades 1,2 and 3 check in by 5:00 PM. All Drummers check in by 5:30 PM. The order of play will follow reverse order of entry (first to enter is last to play, including the mail-in registrants). All contestants are required to play in recognizable Highland attire (except for Chanter class). Best of luck.

Mail-in Entries:

The registristration fee is \$4 per event for OPS members, \$5. for visiting competitors. Mail-in registration may be submitted for the entire season or for selected event dates. Order of play will be determined by entry receipt date, giving advantage to those who pre-register versus day-of entries, so mail in early. Payment must accompany registration. (Sorry, there are no refunds for no shows.)

Day-of Entries:

The entry fee will be \$4 per event for OPS members, \$5. for visiting competitors. Entries will also be accepted until the check-in deadline on the day of the event.

OPS 2008-2009 Competition Schedule

Please note some important changes to this year's competition schedule and requirements.

Schedule: Detailed listing of events is shown in the chart below. There will be no competition in February because of the planned workshop.

Times: -Chanter and Grade 5 - Check in 4:30. Competition 5:00. All other piping grades - Check in 5:00. Be prepared to play. All drumming grades - Check in 5:30. Be prepared to play. You must check in at the competition desk at or before check-in time listed and be prepared to play at check-in time if your steward requests you do so (with the exception of Chanter and Grade 5 entries).

Because we take field entries, we cannot predict the order of play in advance, so be prepared to play first. Order of play will follow reverse order of entry (first to enter is last to play). It is

recommended to use the mail-in entry form for early registration. All contestants are required to play in recognizable Highland attire except Chanter class.

Tune Requirements: All tunes for piping and drumming events are required to be 4 parts. Exceptions are all chanter class and grade 5 piping events where 2 parts of a tune played twice is permitted. Also note specific requirements for certain grade 2 and 1 piping events indicated in the chart below.

Membership: If you live in Oregon or the Portland metro area, including Vancouver WA, one needs to be a member of OPS in order to compete.

Awards will be given at intermission as in previous years.
